Eighteen power packs are going home with students each Friday. We are currently spending about \$250 per month on snacks for kids during the school day. Stacy has started an Angel donor program. A group of people has signed up to make donations when a student has a need.

Staff Appreciation:

The October staff appreciation event was held, staff enjoyed a lunch donated by PTSA parents/committee.

Campus Beautification:

A group of volunteers weeded and barked the front part of the school. May have another event in January.

Reflections:

11 Liberty finalist entries were turned into Issaquah Council chairs on Monday. Invitations to the January 14th reception will be sent home with students who submitted artwork.

Senior Events:
