Students who attend the event can pick out suits, tuxes and formal dresses for homecoming. Another event will be held in the spring to help kids with prom.

Working with local police, hospitals, the district, and the community on communication with students and raising awareness about substance abuse. Would like to pilot a program to install sensors in bathrooms that would detect vapor and changes in sound volume. Will be having a special speaker at the high schools to talk about sexual assault, consent, and intervention.

Stadium update – resubmitted plans to King Co. in hopes of moving forward with new concession stands and restrooms.

Schedule Change – Liberty will change to 7 periods by 2022. Working with staff on ways to use the new "flex time" periods.
