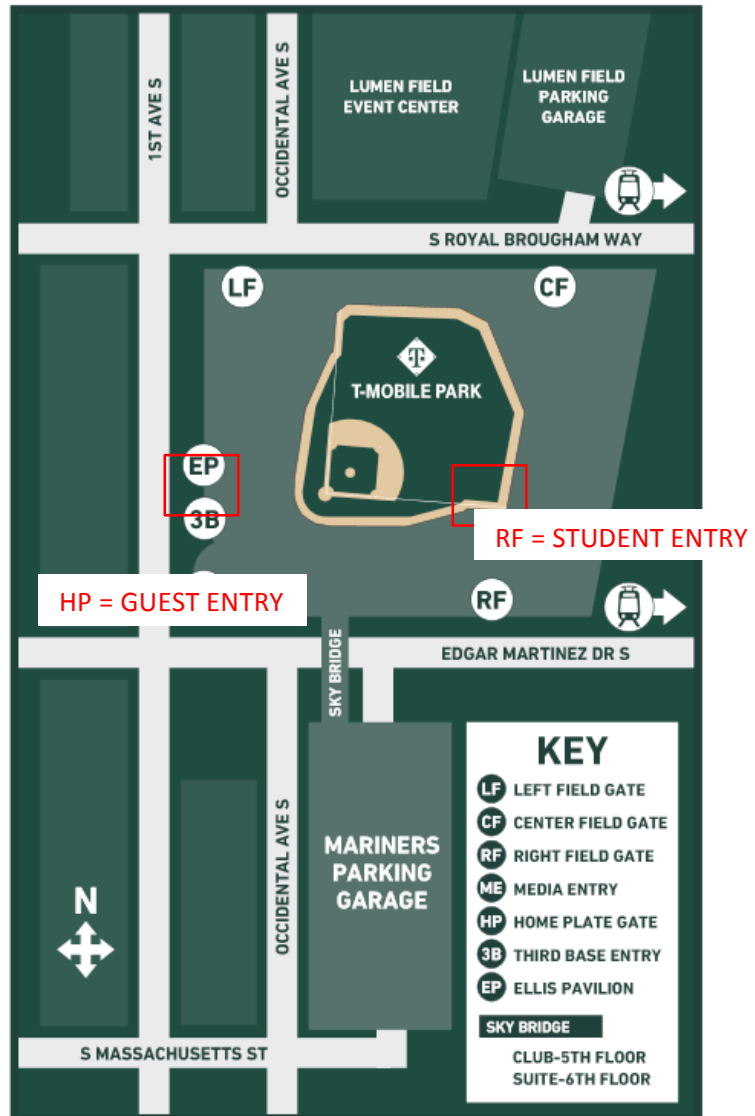


## PARKING AND ENTRY INFORMATION

### PARKING INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS AND GUESTS

- Anyone driving to the park, please park in the Mariners Parking Garage at any available spot. Please make your way to your designated entrance.
- Parking fee is \$10 unless you have a designated parking pass.

- **Guests of graduate, enter at Home Plate Gate.** Please exit the garage on the ground level, walk West on Edgar Martinez Drive, cross the street at the 1<sup>st</sup> avenue crosswalk, and enter Home Plate Gate on the corner of 1<sup>st</sup> and Edgar Martinez Drive
- **Students enter at Right Field Gate.** Please exit the garage on the ground level, walk West on Edgar Martinez Drive, cross the street at the 1<sup>st</sup> avenue crosswalk, walk East, past the Will Call booth, to enter on your left at Right Field Gate. **PLEASE DO NOT JAYWALK ACROSS EDGAR MARTINEZ DRIVE. IT IS A VERY BUSY ROAD AND WILL BE BARCADED OFF FOR YOUR SAFETY.**



### PARKING INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADA NEEDS

- There are ADA spots on each level of the Mariners parking garage.
- Please be aware that guests will need to travel across the street to the park, so we recommend arriving early to have enough time.

## ENTRY FOR STUDENTS AND GUESTS

- No health screenings are required for students or guests upon entry.
- T-Mobile Park staff are positioned outside to provide assistance with the entry process. Guests will pass-through walk-through metal detectors. It is not necessary to remove cell phones, car keys or coins from pockets. If secondary screening is necessary, it will consist of a manual screen with a hand-held metal detector. Guests that are unable to undergo a metal detection search due to medical reasons you will be screened with a hand-held wand.

## IMPORTANT NOTES FOR STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

- It is imperative for families to arrive on time to see their student graduate. There are large amounts of guests coming through the gates of the park with a limited amount of time to get everyone in, specifically in a socially distant manner. We want everyone to feel comfortable finding their seats and settling in before they watch their student cross the stage so we recommend arriving early!

## PROHIBITED ITEMS

- **PROHIBITED ITEMS**
- For everyone's safety, the Mariners do not allow the following items:
- Aerosol containers/bottles (i.e. hairspray, sunscreen, shaving cream, air freshener, spray paint, etc.)
- Alcoholic beverages and non-alcoholic beer, including but not limited to bottles, cans, airline bottles, shooters, flasks and zip-loc bags.
- Aluminum or metal containers, including but not limited to cans, cups, bottles, flasks, urns or thermoses.
- Ammunition
- Animals (other than service animals)
- Audio recording devices
- Balloons, beach balls and other inflatable items
- Baseball bats; provided, however that on the day of the purchase, baseball bats purchased at T-Mobile Park during the game or event will be tagged and permitted for the date of purchase only. Please note that the item may be help for pickup upon exit.
- Beverages—Fans are allowed to bring in one factory sealed plastic bottle of water 32 ounces or less. Soda, coffee or other beverages are not allowed. Guests may bring in one empty plastic reusable bottle 32 ounces or smaller.
- Brooms
- Chairs, stools or bleacher seat backs containing metal
- Cameras and equipment—Cameras 6 inches or larger with the lens fully extended., video cameras, tripods, monopods, extendable gimbals and selfie sticks.
- Coolers—Hard sided and Styrofoam coolers, hard plastic inserts for soft coolers and backpack coolers.
- Drones

- Firecrackers or fireworks
- Flag poles or sticks—PVC, wood or other types of materials
- Flammable liquids or substances
- Flasks
- Glass or ceramic containers, including but not limited to cups, bottles, flasks, bowls, dishes, etc.
- Hoverboards/skateboards/roller skates/roller blades
- Illegal substances
- Laser pointers
- Luggage or duffle bags of any kind
- Noisemakers
- Obscene, offensive or indecent clothing
- Self-defense sprays (including mace, pepper or bear spray)
- Selfie sticks, extendable camera gimbals
- Signs or banners with non-sporting messaging
- Toy guns or knives, including water guns
- Weapons of any kind—Guns, knives, metal tools, brass or plastic knuckles, stun guns, Tasers, cork screws, box cutters, razor blades, scissors, etc.
- Wrapped Packages

#### **ITEMS ALLOWED FOR GRADUATIONS**

- Cameras ARE allowed as long as they are not in a camera bag.
- Blankets ARE allowed as long as not in a bag
- Flowers ARE allowed as long as they are not in a glass/hard vase
- Signs or “fat heads” are allowed as long as they are no larger than 28” x 28” and not on a stick or pole of any kind
- Strollers, wheelchairs, and other mobility products are allowed inside T-Mobile Park.

#### **LOST AND FOUND**

- If guests misplace an item or become separated from their party, guests can call 206-346-4000 for assistance on lost items during normal business hours (M-F 8:30am-5:00pm). Items will be kept for one month before being donated to charity.
